



The college implement the curriculum designed by VBU with which the college is affiliated.Time to time the university redesign the curriculum& at present the CBCS system has been implemented as designed by UGC. Apart from these, we have the academic calendar which we follow for the implementation of the syllabus(CBCS).

• We convene the meeting of the teachers and request to prepare work schedule in such a way so that the courses of study are covered within the academic session.

The teachers are also encouraged to organise feed back classes / interactive classes / class test / seminars / symposium / Workshops/ to insure the maximum benefit to the students.

- We also organise tutorials of doubt class to clear the doubt at each and every step in the form of tutorials.
- The Principal of the college convene meeting with the faculty for collecting the updates regarding the effective implementation of the curriculum.

It has been observed that the students who are quite proficient in their studies are not able to clear their interviews in their competitive exams, keeping in view the IQAC Cell has suggested to start the communicative English courses for 6 months period.

A part from these courses the college has started two units of NSS to make opportunities to the students in acquiring skills & social services through extensive activities which are carried throughout the year in accordance with the annual calendar of NSS.

For the purpose of literary activities the IQAC has suggested to publish the annual magazine of the college and time to time the cultural activities are organised by the college in which the students are encouraged to participate in various forms of the event.

Reservation policy is followed in the admission process. Merit lists of selected students of all different faculties &categories are displayed on the notice board.

Keeping in view to increase the enrolment of ST, SC, OBC, disabled and economically weaker section & minorities students, we have two campus in which one is surrounded by Village inhabited mostly by the population of ST/SC/OBC categories. Due to our efforts large number. of minority students especially the women students are enrolled in our college. There is a cell for scholarship of Minority , ST/SC students who make arrangement for getting benefits from Govt. of Jharkhand/Central Govt.

We provide the condusive atmosphere & ramp facilities in our Campus for disabled students, the following twoacademic session date is itself explanatory for increasing of the said community students.

The students of remote area being provided some relief especially for weaker section by the college.

Free studentship facility is available in the college for the economically weaker section of the students. For the freshing a committee consisting of the Principal and other four members of different faculties who select students on basis of interview & income and make a list which is displayed on notice board.

2.2 CATERING TO STUDENT DIVERSITY

As per the policy of the Govt. of Jharkhand 3% seats are reserved for differently disabled students. Disabled students are provided the facilities of ramp and classes are arranged on the ground floor.

The institution organises department wise pre-induction meet before commencement of academic session to inform the students about the curriculum , examination pattern, marking scheme , general discipline and courses.

Enrichment Courses, etc.)

The departments give the extra attention to the student who are found weak in subject through tutorial classes. The language skills of student are improved through communicative English classes. As many students come from the remote schools where teaching is imparted in vernacular medium and is situated in remote areas. Remedial & tutorial classes are organised during holiday and after the college hours for the slow learner even bilingual method of teaching is adopted in order to make the student to understand the course in better way. The college attempts to bridge the gap in respect to their knowledge, between the students of rural & urban area through personal counselling and guidance by the teachers and remedial classes are sponsored by UGC.

2.2.4 How does the college sensitize its staff and students on issues such as gender, inclusion, environment etc.?

Staff and students are sensitized by the interaction debates, seminars, essay competition, cultural activities, fine arts, art & craft competition, sports both inter class, inter faculty, inter college and university level under the guidance of teachers. We oraganise youth festival of university and science exhibition at local and university level. NSS wing having boys & girls students also interact and participate in various programmes in the college & surrounding areas by organising Camp.

2.2.5 How does the institution identify and respond to special educational/learning needs of advanced learners?

The college teachers are minutely observes all students from very first day and pick out advance learner or extra ordinary students who are especially guided by subject teachers in all the way by arranging extra tutorial classes. Teachers observe advance learner by arranging test series , debate , elucation etc.

2.2.6 How does the institute collect, analyze and use the data and information on the academic performance (through the programme duration) of the students at risk of drop out (students from the disadvantaged sections of society, physically challenged, slow learners, economically weaker sections etc.)?

Each and every faculty look after the long absencein some cases of the students. It is observed that 03% students drop out every year as the college is situated in rural economically backward area. Every faculty head submit the report of long absentees to the admission committee with their roll no. and names.

The admission committee make contact to their guardian as well as the students and try to know the reason about the absence of their ward. The following are the reasons of the dropout as observed by the admission committee.

- (a) Poverty As the college is situated in economically backward area and the some of the student who are not only the student but also the bread earner of the family, hence they find hard to persue their studies.
- (b) Even today , the society of the surrounding areas are conservative &orthodox. Some of the students get married early and drop out in the mid of the session.
- (c) The college is situated in coal bearing areas where most of the miners are illiterate and even today they find themselves hard to know the "knowledge is power" and hence the education is not find place in the uppermost part of their priority list.

2.3 **<u>TEACHING LEARNING PROCESS</u>**

Before the commencement of the academic session the institution plan & prepare the academiccalender with the consultation of staff council

of the college, keeping in view the list of holidays, examination, cocurricular activities . The academiccalendar is displayed on the notice board & Web site. The system is a bit flexible as the college had make adjustment in accordance with the schedule.

The faculty head in consultation with the faculty teachers prepare the teaching plan and is notified to the students well in advance. The examination & evaluation process is followed by the department as designed by the university.

Time to time the institution takes the test exam apart from the scheduled university exam & on the basis of the performance of the students in the said test exam teachers give extra attention to the student.

The IQAC has been formed under the chairmanship of the Principal of the college Dr. R.K. Das and member Secretary Dr. M. Ahmad in the month of Jan 2012 with a decision that IQAC will conduct meeting once a month and will also suggest the improvement of the quality of teaching learning process of teacher & student both. Certain areas are located by the IQAC which needed to be strengthened in the college such as student needed some help in communication English, Computing skill to make themselves efficient to get job and quality field.

IQAC also recommended department wise regular meeting of teachers & parents. On the initiative of the IQAC, the meeting of Alumni association get regular.





They come for further help in the form of repairing of building, donating construction materials, Electric Fan, etc.

The college has been donated 5 laks by the M.P fund by Sri Yashwant Sinha , Former Finance Minister and a big hall has been constructed from that fund. A big hall has been constructed by the generous help of the then MLA of Barkagoan, Sri Lok Nath Mahto.

We had invited two companies for the placement of the students where the students couldnot communicate in english hence we decided to start the said course.

The PRACTICE : As the course is inclusive to the students of all stream so we design the course regardless of the class and stream. The decision of the designing of the course circulated widely among the stake holder , Parents, Guardian, teaching & non teaching staff, students. It also put permanantly on the website of the college & notice board. The faculty members also conveyed the design& duration of the course in the class room. The Principal of the college also addresses the student and spoke atlength about the prospects and the design of the

course. The expert teachers plan that course of the communicative english would be 6 months about 75 classes.

EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

As the course is in its primary stage and the programme has been started in the month of sept 2015 and only one batch of student is about to complete the course so it is much early to say about the success of the students but we are hopeful and getting applaud from our stake holders and guardian for the beginning of the course.

PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED:

We have got some of the unavoided but not a serious problem while completing our goal in the college. As we have already mentioned that the college is situated in rural area where students mostly come from the school which prefer Vernacular language in teaching method. S the students faced problem while facing interviews in or out of the campus. They feel hesitation in communication with other . Hence we had worked hand to overcom this problem upto maximum extent.




