1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

It was the pride moment for the residents of Ramgarh area particularly Barkakana, Sayal, Argada and all allied areas of coalfield and surrounding villages when CCL announced to open a college for higher education by the collaborative decision of worker of the coalfield to donate a part of salary for the opening of the collage. It was the time of Silver Jubilee Celebration Year and proposal executed. Foundation stone was laid down by the then Governor of Bihar in 1981. Coalfield ltd provided the proper place about 9 acres of land for the construction of the college with excellence. Construction completed in 1983 and C.C.L. authority formed a committee who advertised the recruitment of staff and selected through interview when only higher qualified person with excellent result and depth of the knowledge had been recruited. College started in September 1983 with all three faculties Arts, Science and Commerce. By that time Jubilee College was the only higher study Centre for Science. It was then affiliated to Ranchi University and now in Vinoba Bhave University Hazaribagh when Vinoba Bhave University came into existence in 2012. Jubilee name has been chosen from the "Silver Jubilee" as coalfield celebrating Silver Jubilee year in 1981. Since 1983 college is growing more and more with increasing number of students every academic year. College establishing bench mark in the field of higher education in the area and people talk about the success, dedication, sincerity, depth of knowledge and infrastructure including maintained laboratory and library. College is registered under the Society act 21 of 1860 Jubilee Samajik avm Saikshnik Vikas Sansthan Reg.no. 422/2005-2006. It is important to mention here that college is co-education admitting both boys and girls. Residents of the area are fearless in sending their girl child for higher study in the college with the lapse of the time college has been registered under 12 Band 2F of U.G.C. in 2012 and got ISO 9001-2015 certification. College has been accredited by NAAC in 2017 achieved 1.89 credit score with "C" grade.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The curricular aspects are the main component of any institute but being affiliated college does not exercise complete freedom in curriculum design and implementation. The college depends on university for legitimate academic process. However the institution has developed a structure and effective system of curriculum implementation by following academic calendar, designing lesson plans updating library and providing cool atmosphere to students. The students are given practical insight into the curriculum through a series interactive activity like class room teaching, group discussions, debates and lecture series from neighbouring college with whom MOU has been signed. As we have both CBCS and FYUGP programs running in the college so facilities keep themselves active to complete the courses in time, preparation of internal examination papers and evaluation. Meeting of teachers called before the commencement of new session and before the examination to review the syllabus to be taught, lesion wise in allotted time per chapter and preparation of question papers for internal exams. Examination papers are distributed among the course wise teachers for evaluation. Marks given are tabulated and displayed with transparency. Doubts regarding marks are solved immediately.

The college gives ample of freedom and flexibility in course selection to the students by adopting CBCS since 2015 and FYUGP from 2022. Students have been given option to stop first course and switch to second course. Beside main course, the college promotes activities which integrate cross cutting issues of gender and environment. University and college have introduced environmental science for all streams in both CBCS and FYUGP course as compulsory subject. Yoga, health wellness and constitution of India subject have been introduced as compulsory subject in FYUGP. Students get the knowledge about this course. The institution sensitizes people regarding gender issue by organizing awareness programs in the community. NSS unit organizes different extension programs in nearby areas and in the college students are counseled regarding human values and professional ethics.

In order to receive feedback from stack holders, parents & students to overcome the loop holes which are reviewed and discussed to solve it.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The institution is known for its best teaching and cool environment which is maintained and growing day by day. The institution follows the reservation policy of the government in the admission and appointment as well. Student teachers ratio in the college is not appropriate as the college is partially self-financed and partially aided hence running the college with guest teachers beside full time teachers. The institution assesses the learning level of the students periodically by conducting regular oral or MCQ test and semester end internal examination. The number of which is aided with the final exam organized by the university. The students are made to know about their learning outcomes. The slow and advanced learners are categorized in order to get their individual needs. Special tutorial classes are arranged for slow learners whereas the advance learners are exposed to more advanced care in order to enhance their learning outcome. Teacher also encourages students by using ICT technologies to make the teaching learning process much friendly and effective. Sometimes lecture is made much interesting by the use of PPT, Virtual Demonstration and use of smart class.

Internal assessment is transparent and efficient same model questions are asked as in the final examinations. Evaluation process is quick and answer books are continuously checked without any partiality. Necessary feedback is collected from the students and grievance cell related to evaluation or examination.

The teachers of the college are well educated as resourceful. About 40% of the teachers are Ph.D. and attended seminars, workshop, conference time to time to increase their learning resource.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The institution is under graduate with normal traditional course hence meager chance to go for research activities. The institution doesn't get any grant from government or non-government sources for research activities. Though faculty undertake research activity by publishing article/books/chapter in different journals. Moreover a part of the faculty development program of UGC/IGNOU, the faculty members participate in orientation/Refresh course, workshop and conferences. Recently PDP program by IGNOU has been conducted where faculties participated and secured A or A+ credits.

The institution strives to develop research aptitude among the students, in these regards creative learning is encouraged. The Students express their research aptitude by virtue of their participation in debates, Seminars and guest Lecture series and write up in the college magazine.

The institution adopts innovative practices in teaching learning and research methodology in compliance to IQAC periodic minutes. More scientific and study friendly teaching methodology are being practical for the effective delivery of knowledge. The creative abilities of the students are carefully judge and harassed. The activities are constantly being taken into account and reported to IQAC of the college.

As part of the social responsibility and in order to sensitize students, institution conducts several extension and exposure activities. These includes cleanliness drive attain the nearly communities, campus or adopted village, organizing blood donation camp in collaboration with red cross society/RIMS/LIONS or Rotary Club, Celebrating AIDS day, Earth day, Environment day, Jayanties, Organizing Garden Sensitizing programs. Time

to time skill development program course is introduced only undergraduate course hence no well renounced companies conduct placement drive through institute invites small companies who recruited several students.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

To fulfill the changing demand of modern academic era and to promote the effective teaching-learning process, college has always given emphasis on the creation and up gradation of infrastructures. To create new infrastructure, college utilizes the funds by collection of fees. The funds are expended to renovate the college buildings, class-rooms, laboratories, library, time to time, wherever required. The college is taking effective measures for modernizing the way of teaching. For that purpose, ICT enabled teaching-learning has been introduced in almost all the departments. Digitally equipped seminar rooms have been prepared in some of the departments with LCD projectors, laptops, and computers. Every department is provided with internet The institution has a well maintained, user friendly and resilient infrastructure conducive to teaching, learning and comprehensive development of students. The Institution has two storage building consisting of 21 Rooms for Academics and administrative rooms. Teaching Block has well-appointed and spacious classrooms, tutorial rooms, department rooms, Geography Lab, Science lab (Physics, Chemistry, Botany, and Zoology). The Seminar hall equipped with projectors so that ICT can be used for strengthening academic discourse. There are computer labs available for the students. These labs have adequate computer Equipment, internet connectivity and projectors to support practical sessions. The campus is Wi-Fi enabled for the benefit of students and faculty. The College has very good Library, Wi-Fi enabled and has 50 seating capacity. CCTV Facilities available for safety and security of the college. The Administrative Block of the college consists of the Principal's Office, Examination Office, Teacher Common Room, All subject separate departments, the General Office, NSS office. The magnificent Seminar Hall(Gallery), which for Academic events like conferences, seminars, talks etc. and student activities, Hostel facilities available in this institution. For physical challenge students, RAMP and Wheel Chair facilities are also available.

Student Support and Progression

Providing value-based education besides along with regular university syllabus to inculcate human values among the students and staff through programmes like prevention of sexual harassment, anti-ragging, and personality development. The representation of the NSS volunteer, cultural, sports activities, and rank holders from each class in various activities help in leadership development of the learners. The Teachers identifies student related issues and problems and helps the College administration through meetings and effective dialogues in resolving those. The Principal, Bursar and the Controller of Examinations provides the necessary help to organise, sports events, debate and elocution competitions which are held regularly. Scholarship and free-ship facility is available. about 60% students are benefitted from this scheme. Jubilee College, Bhurkunda has also in registered an Alumni Association. The Alumni Association account has been opened and about 30000/- contribution has been contributed till date. Alumni Association meetings are regularly organised. They provide the professional guidance to the students.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The College has a clearly defined declaration of its Vision, Mission and Objectives. The functioning of the College is in consonance with the defined statements. The College focuses on socially and economically

deprived students and social values. The Principal and the staff closely monitor the developmental activities of the students. Teachers-parents, teacher-pupil meetings are held periodically and feedback is taken online and offline both. The participation of students in celebrations of the days is very well. The teachers and Principal inspires the students for various activities. The College belongs to the private management. The College follows a policy of decentralization and participatory management system. The IQAC has been constituted. IQAC plays proactive role in ensuring teaching-learning and administration of the College. Teaching and non-teaching staff are involved in

implementation of the decisions for the benefit of the students. Eligible and competent staff is engaged by the management. The College has organized internal and external audit regularly. Accountant General's (AG) audit is conducted. The College has been granted permanent affiliation by the Department of Human Resource Development, State Government of Jharkhand. The Governing Body (GB) is the controlling and managing authority of the College. The College is grant-in-aid by the State Government and therefore EPF Scheme is made applicable to the staff. In addition to this the college management also provides medical facility and advance against the requirement to the employees. The service rules prescribed by the State Government are equally applicable to the staff.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The institution celebrates all National day in the college and the respective department in the college campus. The college celebrates every year of Swami Viveka Nand Jayanti and National Youth Day - 12 January with the help of NSS unit of the college. World Aids Day-01 December, Teachers Day – 05, Semtember, Voters Day 25 January, Gandhi Jayanti - 02 October, International Women Day- 8th March , World HIndi Divas- 14 September etc. Jubilee College, It involved the unfurling of the National Flag, an event by NSS, and distribution of sweets among students and staff members on the occasion of Independence Day. The institution always keeps running for free of Poverty, Corruption, Terrorism, Communalism and Castism, Which is collaborated with National Service Scheme's "Cleanliness Drive" for a week under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. The college also organizes the events to commemorate the birth and death anniversaries of famous personalities like Mahatma Gandhi, Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. The events include lecture by eminent speakers from diverse fields and conducting inter college competitions like Essay writing, Slogan writing, Poster Making, Cleanliness Drive, etc. The system of education in the classroom shows that the institution provides better education to the rural area students. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

Examination are conducted as per schedule mentioned in the calendar there are two examination for each semester of which one theory and one practical for core and generic courses or only theory for none. Practical subjects conducted internally providing some pattern of questions as asked in final examination. College conduct examination for 20 marks for core subject and 15 marks for generic subject dividing marks in different header like written exam (theory and practical), attendance, overall behaviour etc. Question as per curriculum of affiliating university are uploaded in the WhatsApp group, and website from here students and university can browse and review its standard.

The college has a mechanism to deal with the internal examination related grievances. First of all, college tries that there should not be any grievance regarding internal examination. If so, the college tries using mechanism. There are two type of Examinations in the college viz., internal examination organized by the college and external examination (or, university examination) organized by the university. There are 6 internal examinations, and 6 are terminal exams, the internal examinations are based on project/presentation and written test, while the external examination is the semester examination. All the discrepancies regarding examination, faced by the college, is immediately brought to the notice of the Controller of Examinations of the college as well as university of VBU, Hazaribag; and corrections, if any, are done only after getting instructions from the University. It is very transparent and time-bound. Sometimes, it so happens that in the university examinations, the students get questions which are out of syllabus. As soon as the students point out, the Centre Superintendent immediately apprises the Controller of Examinations of University over phone. The problem can be solved only on the advice of the Controller of Examinations. In brief, the grievance are resolved in the following manner:

(a) Before Examination: Common grievances of students before the examination are late application form filing, non-receipt of admit card of examinations or wrong entries in the same. In either case, grievances

are communicated to University Examination Section and resolved at the earliest. College Exam Cell helps the student for filing the application form.

- (b) During Examination: (i) Internal Examination: During internal Examinations, if any student finds discrepancy in question, e.g. given answer options are not correct, data given in question is insufficient or options are repeated, out-of syllabus questions students may report it as invalid question. Committee at University takes cognizance and resolves the grievance. (ii) Theory Examination: College Instant reports to University Examination Section, if there are any grievances regarding question papers of any subject. Grievances regarding question paper include questions asked out of syllabus, typing errors, etc.
- (c) After Result Declaration After result declaration by university, if any student has objection with result, he/she comes to College Exam Controller for the same. College Exam Controller addresses their issues. If students are not satisfied about their marks, he/she may apply for online revaluation/scrutiny form.

5. CONCLUSION

So far badmintons, chess, football and kho-kho inter college tournaments have been arranged. The college produces excellent kho-kho players and clinched Championship in boy's kho-kho for 6th time and runner up in girl's event for 6th time.

College is enriched with about 7000 odd books in the library including books for competition. Collage is also arranging skill enhancement programs to enrich the mindset of students to face challenges and interviews.
